Robin Hawdon (Playwright) Robin Hawdon's career had spanned many different aspects of show business. As an actor in the sixties and seventies he played leading parts in London's West End, classical parts in the provinces such as Hamlet, Henry V and Henry Higgins, and his face became well known on TV where he appeared in various series, and on the big screen, where he starred in When Dinosaurs Ruled The Earth, and Zeta One. Meanwhile his writing career developed with productions in the Edinburgh, Kings Lynn and Salzburg festivals, followed by the


major commercial success of The Mating Game which ran for two years in the Wes End and has since played in over thirty different countries. This was followed by other comedies such as Birthday Suite, Perfect Wedding and Shady Business, which have all been produced around America, Europe and elsewhere. His comedy Don't Dress For Dinner (based on a French play by Marc Camoletti) ran for six years London, and was produced in New York in the spring of 2012. More serious plays such as Revenge, The Old Devils (stage adaptation of Kingsley Amis's Booker Prizwinner) and God And Stephen Hawking have also been published and performed in several countries. He has a new novel titled Survival Of The Fittest (a detective story about the real implications of Darwinism) was recently published by SBPRA. Hawdon was Theatre Director at the Bath Theatre Royal during the eighties, and currently has productions playing in France, Germany, Russia, Poland, Italy, Scandinavia, the USA, and elsewhere. He is married with two daughters, four grand children, and homes in the UK, South of France and Australia.



Matthew Wiener (Director) Matthew is thrilled to return to NCRT and the San Diego area after directing SHIPWRECKED! and Lend Me a Tenor. This is Matthew's 18th season as Producing Artistic Director of Actors Theatre of Phoenix.
