(Co-Founder, Artistic Director) Mr. Woodhouse co-founded San Diego REPertory Theatre with D.W. Jacobs in 1976, and

has since served as itsproducing and artistic director. He has worked as a director, producer or actor on more than 250 REP productions. Mr. Woodhouse has performed as an actor on the REP stages in The Seafarer, in the title role of King Lear, Proof, Hamlet, and with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra in the title role of Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat. His most recent directorial work with the REP includes: The Who's TOMMY, In the Next Room or the vibrator play, Superior Donuts, Hairspray, boom, The Threepenny Opera, Water & Power, Clybourne Park, and Federal Jazz Project. In 2011 he directed American Night: The Ballad of Juan José for the Denver Center Theatre Company.
