
STEPHEN SONDHEIM (Music & Lyrics) wrote the music and lyrics for *Saturday Night* (1954), *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* (1962), *Anyone Can Whistle* (1964), *Company* (1970), *Follies* (1971), *A Little Night Music* (1973), *The Frogs* (1974), *Pacific Overtures* (1976), *Sweeney Todd* (1979), *Merrily We Roll Along* (1981), *Sunday in the Park With George* (1984), *Into the Woods* (1987), *Assassins* (1991), *Passion* (1994) and *Road Show* (2008) as well as lyrics for *West Side Story* (1957), *Gypsy* (1959) and *Do I Hear A Waltz*? (1965) and additional lyrics for *Candide* (1973). Anthologies of his work include *Side by Side by Sondheim* (1976), *Marry Me a Little* (1981), *You're Gonna Love Tomorrow* (1983), *Putting it Together* (1993/99) and *Sondheim On Sondheim* (2010). He composed the scores of the films *Stavisky* (1974) and *Reds* (1981) and songs for *Dick Tracy* (1990) and the television production *Evening Primrose* (1966). His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: *Finishing the Hat* (2010) and *Look*, *I Made A Hat* (2011). In 2010 the Broadway theater formerly known as Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honor.

CRAIG LUCAS (Co-Conceiver) has won the Obie for Best American Play for Small Tragedy and the New York Film Critics Award for Best Screenplay for The Secret Lives of Dentists. His plays include Reckless, Blue Window, Prelude to a Kiss, God's Heart, The Dying Gaul, Missing Persons and Stranger. He wrote the screenplays for Longtime Companion, Prelude to a Kiss and Reckless, and The Dying Gaul, which he also directed. In 2001 he received an Obie for his direction of Harry Kondoleon's Saved or Destroyed. Lucas wrote the book for the musical The Light in the Piazza, music and lyrics by Adam Guettel; the musical play Three Postcards with music and lyrics by Craig Carnelia; the opera libretti for Orpheus in Love for composer Gerald Busby; and he co-authored This Thing of Darkness with playwright David Schulner. His awards include the Excellence in Literature Award from the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the PEN/Laura Pels mid-career achievement award, the Outer Critics, L.A. Drama Critics, Drama Logue and LAAMBDA Literary Awards; he has also received a Tony nomination, fellowships from the Guggenheim and Rockefeller Foundations, the NEA and the PEW Charitable Trust and has been a Pulitzer Finalist. He is the Associate Artistic Director [here] at Intiman, a member of the Dramatists Guild, the ACLU, PEN. and serves on the board of Planned Parenthood. He divides his time between New York and Seattle.

NORMAN RENE (Co-Conceiver) collaborated with Craig Lucas on *Marry Me A Little* (1981), Missing Persons (1981), *Blue Window* (1984), the original musical *Three Postcards* (1987), *Reckless* (1988, Drama Desk Award nomination), and *Prelude to a Kiss* (1990, Obie Award for Best Director, Drama Desk Award nomination). Broadway: *Prelude to a Kiss*, George Furth's *Precious Sons* (1986). Films: *Longtime Companion* (1990), *Prelude to a Kiss*, *Reckless*. He died on May 24, 1996 of AIDS.

JAMES VASQUEZ (Director, Chorepgraphy & Scenic Design) is happy to bring Marry Me A Little to Diversionary as Marriage Equality is being celebrated more and more throughout the country. Previous Diversionary credits include the world premiere of Harmony, Kansas, the west coast premieres of Birds of a Feather, [title of show], and Fair Use, as well as Pippin, Next Fall and Twist. He directed the workshop production of Harmony, Kansas for the 13th Annual Festival of New Works at the Goodspeed Opera House. At the Old Globe, he's directed Dr. Seuss's How the Grinch Stole Christmas and Richard O'Brien's Rocky Horror Show, and provided musical staging for A Midsummer Night's Dream and Boeing-Boeing. He won the Craig Noel Award for Outstanding Direction of a Musical in 2010 for Cygnet's Sweeney Todd. In 2004, James founded Daisy 3 Pictures with Mark Holmes and Carrie Preston. Their first two feature films, 29th and Gay (TLA Releasing, Here TV) and Ready? OK! (Wolfe Video, LOGO) have played national and international film festivals, with Ready? OK! winning the Best Feature Film award in Seattle, North Carolina, and San Diego. Their latest feature film, That's What She Said, starring Anne Heche, made it's world premiere at the 2012 Sundance Film Festival. As an actor, James has appeared on film, television, Off-Broadway, regional and local stages. He is a graduate of the Juilliard School of Drama.

TONY HOUCK(Musical Director) is very excited to be in a new position for this production. This is his first time music directing a show. He plays numerous parts at Diversionary, on stage and off, the most recent being writing and starring in the smash cabaret hit Miss Kitty's Wild West Revue.
