SHOLEM ALEICHEM

Born in 1859, Sholem Aleichem wrote under a pseudonym when he started publishing work in Yiddish instead of the more respectable and liturgical language of Hebrew. The translation of his chosen name

means "peace be upon you" in Hebrew which was considered a greeting in slang and was more appropriate for his writings in the more cultural language of Yiddish. By 1890, he had become one of the



most prominent writers of Yiddish literature. In his will he expressed the wish, "Let my name be recalled with laughter." To this day his name is remembered with the heartbreak of the Jewish people as well as the laughter of joy and celebration.
