∞ A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR ANNIE HINTON ∞

I jumped at the chance to direct this Obie Award-winning play because there are so many things I love about Annie Baker's work: the motley crew of quirky characters, the naturalistic way her characters speak with nuanced, sparse dialogue, the clues that are revealed but not put together until scenes later, and her fascination with small town sensibilities.

Annie Baker was very influenced by Chekhov, and, like Chekhovian characters, these Shirley, Vermont residents are preoccupied with learning to accept disappointment in their lives. These lovelorn characters, regretful over misspent youth and missed opportunities, bump up against each other in poignant moments that are touching and awkward and funny.

One caveat: Annie Baker is obsessed with pauses and silences and cares more for content than form. "Circle Mirror Transformation without pauses is a satire," she says and provides a chart with instructions as to how long each pause or silence (long and short) is. We are following it exactly as prescribed!

ANNIE BAKER (Playwright): Annie Baker grew up in Amherst, Massachusetts. Her full-length plays include The Flick (Playwrights Horizons, Obie Award for Playwriting, Susan Smith Blackburn Prize), Circle Mirror Transformation (Playwrights Horizons, Obie Award for Best New American Play, Drama Desk nomination for Best Play), The Aliens (Rattlestick Playwrights Theater, Obie Award for Best New American Play), Body Awareness (Atlantic Theater Company, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle nominations for Best Play/Emerging Playwright), and an adaptation of Anton Chekhov's Uncle Vanya, for which she also designed the costumes (Soho Rep). Her plays have been produced regionally by South Coast Rep, Guthrie Theater, Victory Gardens, Artists Rep, Huntington Theatre Company, Seattle Rep, Studio Theatre in DC, Hyde Park Theatre, Kansas City Rep, Marin Theater Company, A Red Orchid and over 100 other theaters across the country. Her work has also been produced internationally in England, Australia, Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Peru, Venezuela, Mexico, Latvia, and Russia. Annie is a member of New Dramatists, MCC's Playwrights Coalition, and EST, and she is an alumna of Youngblood, Ars Nova's Play Group, and the Soho Rep Writer/Director Lab. Recent honors include a residency at Signature Theatre, USA Artists Fellowship, New York Drama Critics Circle Award, a Susan Smith Blackburn Prize nomination, a Lilly Award, a Time Warner Storytelling Fellowship, a MacDowell fellowship, the Steinberg Playwriting Award and a Master Artist Residency at Atlantic Center for the Arts. A published anthology of her work, The Vermont Plays, is available from TCG Books. Upcoming projects include a production of Circle Mirror Transformation (or what the Russians call "Rotating Mirrors") at the Moscow Art Theatre.
