An anti-war comedy

Lysistrata Jones is a modern retelling of Lysistrata written by Ancient Greek playwright, Aristophanes. The play was performed as part of the Greater Dionysia festival, which celebrated plays and honored the Gods.

Like all of Arisophanes' plays, politics, religion, and sex (which included nudity & obscenity) were frankly discussed in Lysistrata. Tragedy and satyr-drama's were also performed but had more restrictions than comedy. Comedy used a colloquial language which made it free to include indecent and obscene material.

Lysistrata was performed in front of Athenian audiences in the midst of the Peloponnesian War.

At the time, the Peloponnesian War had been going on for a little over 20 years.

Lysistrata is one of Aristophanes most well-known plays as it is still performed 2,000 years later. Lysistrata was written as an anti-war play and is usually performed today at the start of unpopular wars. In 2011, a group of women in a sewing cooperative in Dado (a village in the Philippines) organized a sex strike until their men stopped a separatist rebellion which had been going on over 30 years. The rebellion stopped within a week. In 2012, there was another sex strike in Togo, a small country in West Africa. The women called for the sex strike as a way of getting the President to resign.

The fact that women are still finding ways to incorporate the ideologies of *Lysistrata* into their lives speaks to the talents and wisdom of Aristophanes and his ability to reach his audiences.
