The inspiration for In The Heights

by Sophie Cripe, Dramaturg

Lin-Manuel Miranda wrote this play about the Hispanic world he knows in Washington Heights. It's a story set in the real world that doesn't feel the need to include the negative stereotypical "drugs, gangs and violence." Instead, it explores the concept of home, what it means to different people, and what happens when that "home" begins to change.

It's only fitting then that much of the story is pulled from his own life, growing up in Inwood (a suburb north of Washington Heights):

The music in the play is inspired by

the tapestry of music Miranda heard walking from 181st Street to 191st Street: the boleros wafting from apartment buildings, the rap blaring from boom boxes, the merengue coming from bodegas on the corner. Miranda would later say *In The Heights* is "an old-fashioned Broadway musical with a new musical language where latin pop music, hip-hop and musical theater are friends!"

Edmunda Claudia, Miranda's compulsive gambler surrogate grandmother, appears in the show as Abuela Claudia.

Sonny reflects views of Miranda's political activist father.

The power outage in the play was inspired by an actual power outage in Washington Heights on July 5 and 6, 1999. This particular outage is rather infamous and caused quite a few problems for the residents.

In May of 2009, Lin-Manuel received the degree of Doctor of Human letters, honoris causa, from Yeshiva University, the youngest recipient of such an honor in the University's 123-year history. As an actor, Lin-Manuel received a 2007 Theater World Award for Outstanding Debut Performance, and the 2007 Clarence Derwent Award for Most Promising Male Performance courtesy of Actor's Equity Foundation. Lin-Manuel is a co-founder and member of Freestyle Love Supreme, a popular hip-hop improv group that performs regularly in New York City. The group has also toured the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, as well as the Aspen, Melbourne and Montreal Comedy Festivals. He currently lives in New York



Quiara Alegria Hudes (Book) is most recently the author of *The Elliot Cycle*, three standalone plays written over an eight year period. Each play uses a different kind of music— Bach, Coltrane, and Puerto Rican

folk music--to trace the coming of age of a bright but haunted young Puerto Rican man. Elliot, A Soldier's Fugue, the first play, was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in 2007. Oanh Nguyen (Director/Artistic Director) has been serving as Chance Theater's founding artistic since 1999. He is also the Producing Associate at South Coast Repertory, where he spearheads Studio SCR.

Oanh is a recipient of TCG's New Generations Grant and the TCG Nathan Cummings Young Leaders of Color Fellowship. He was awarded the Outstanding Artist Award by Arts Orange County, profiled in OC Weekly's 2014 People Issue, inducted into Anaheim High School's Hall of Fame and recently gave the commencement speech to the 2014 graduation class of Chapman University College of Performing Arts. Oanh also served on the advisory board of the Anaheim High School Performing Arts Conservatory, the board of the Network of Ensemble Theatres, LA's 99-seat Transitional Committee, and grant panels for the National Endowment of the Arts and Theatre Communications Group. Oanh is a proud member of SDC and SAG-AFTRA. His directing credits include productions at Chance Theater, East West Players,

the J. Paul Getty Museum, Segerstrom Center for the Arts, and South Coast Repertory, and served as the Associate Director for the international tour of David Henry Hwang's Chinglish (Berkeley Repertory, South Coast Repertory, Hong Kong Arts Festival).
