Proclamation of the City Council City of San Diego

SPRECKELS ORGAN CENTENNIAL DAY

December 31, 2014 Presented By Mayor Kevin L. Faulconer and Council President Todd Gloria

WHEREAS, John D. Spreckels and his brother, Adolph, commissioned the Spreckels Organ Pavilion as a first-of-its-kind outdoor music amphitheater in Balboa Park that could uplift, educate, and inspire a worldwide audience; and,

WHEREAS, on December 31, 1914, the Spreckels brothers dedicated the organ pavilion to "the people of San Diego" and "the people of all the world" before U.S. President Woodrow Wilson ceremoniously brought the organ to life and illuminated the pavilion for the first time, signifying the launch of the Panama-California Exposition; and,

WHEREAS, in 1915, during the Panama-California Exposition, the Spreckels Organ Pavilion served as a main attraction for guests thanks to a music committee headed by Gertrude Gilbert, who also notably produced music for Sunday morning services at the pavilion for enlisted sailors stationed in San Diego; and,

WHEREAS, during the 1960's and 1970's, with the mainstream prominence of rock-and-roll music, the Spreckels Organ Pavilion fell into a state of deterioration and risked being demolished, but through the combined efforts of the City of San Diego, a local non-profit, and private donations from residents, sufficient funds were raised to repair and improve the organ pavilion; and,

WHEREAS, in 1986, after the completion of modern restorations, the International Summer Organ Festival began offering guests with summertime night concerts from some of the world's most renown organists and composers; and,

WHEREAS, today, the Spreckels Organ, with 4,518 pipes and 73 ranks, is the largest outdoor organ in the western hemisphere and continues to offer free musical programs to residents and visitors of San Diego; and,

WHEREAS, the Spreckels Organ Society, as the primary operator and curator of the organ pavilion, has produced numerous recordings showcasing the musical performances and created a museum experience for visitors in an effort to sustain the Circle of Giving model introduced by the Spreckels brothers; and,

WHEREAS, on December 31, 2014, the Spreckels Organ Society will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the first Spreckels Organ Pavilion concert that launched the Panama-California Exposition with musical performances from San Diego Civic Organist Dr. Carol Williams and others who will represent San Diego's past and present; and,

WHEREAS, in celebration of the Spreckels Organ Pavilion's centennial and its unique connection to the rich history of San Diego and Balboa Park, the City of San Diego wishes to recognize and pay tribute to this local landmark; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT PROCLAIMED, BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, does hereby declare December 31, 2014 to be "SPRECKELS ORGAN CENTENNIAL DAY" in the City of San Diego.
