AARON ACOSTA (Simon) NVA: Debut. CREATIVE ENSEMBLE BIOS

WILLIAM GOLDING (Novel) (1911 - 1993). Sir Golding was an English novelist, poet and playwright whose most famous work is LORD OF THE FLIES. Other works include RITES OF PASSAGE (winner of the 1980 Booker McConnell Prize), PINCHER MARTIN, FREE FALL and THE PYRAMID. Sir Golding was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1983 and was knighted in 1988 by Queen Elizabeth II.

NIGEL WILLIAMS (Adaptor) Williams is an Emmy nominated playwright, novelist and screenwriter. His first novel *MY LIFE CLOSED TWICE* won the 1978 Somerset Maugham Award. For his screen adaptation of William Horwood's *Skallagrigg* (1994) he won a television BAFTA. Williams was also the primary scriptwriter for the second season - based on Greek myths - of the acclaimed *Jim Henson's Storyteller* series. Williams' best known work is the 2005 TV drama *Elizabeth I* featuring Helen Mirren as the title character.

JUSTIN LANG (Director) NVA: Director: Complete Works of Shakespeare Abridged [Revised], Comedy of Errors, To Kill A Mockingbird (Co-Director), Wait Until Dark (Assistant Director), Ah, Wilderness!
