Basil Kreimendahl: Basil's play Sidewinders, won the Rella Lossy Playwright's Award and had its world premiere at The Cutting Ball Theater in San Francisco. Orange Julius was developed at the 2012 O'Neill National Playwrights Conference and was included in La Jolla Playhouse's DNA new work series. Basil was commissioned by Actors Theatre of Louisville for Remix 38 at the 2014 Humana Festival of New Plays. Basil's plays have also been developed by New York Theatre Workshop, About Face Theatre, Inkwell, Rattlestick, WordBRIDGE, The LARK, and The Oregon Shakespeare Festival. Basil has been a Jerome Fellow and is a current McKnight fellow. A recipient of an Arts Meets Activism grant from the Kentucky Foundation for Women for theatre work with the trans community in Louisville, Basil has taught playwriting to elementary, high school, and college students, founded and ran a playwrights group for queer youth in Louisville called Out On The Edge, and was the Provost's Visiting Writer at the University of Iowa 2013/2014.
