

RON CAMPBELL (R. BUCKMINSTER FULLER)

Ron Campbell is delighted to be back at San Diego REP to play "Bucky." He has performed everywhere from the streets of Paris to the Royal Albert Hall in London, the Fuji Dome in Japan, the Ancient Theatre of Epidaurus in Greece, The Habima in Israel, The American Conservatory Theatre, The Mark Taper Forum, The Mercury Theatre (Chicago), The Huntington Theatre (Boston), Seattle Rep, Berkeley Rep, TheatreWorks Jacobs co-founded San and The Actors' Gang, but he considers San Diego REP to be his theatrical home. Ron was lead clown in Cirque du Soleil's Kooza and created Cecil B. DeGrille for Teatro ZinZanni. His many roles include Don Quixote, Sherlock Holmes, Cyrano and Richard III. Other One Man Shows: The Thousandth Night, Shylock, The Dybbuk, The Boneman of Benares and A Tale of Two Cities. His awards include Critics Circle Awards in Los Angeles and San Francisco, the 2015 TBA Award for Best Actor and nominations for Jeff and Helen Hayes Awards. Ron is an Associate Artist of the California Shakespeare

Theatre and recipient of the Fox Fellowship for Distinguished Achievement. Ron holds a 3rd degree rank in the martial art of laido. For more info check SoarFeat.org



D.W. JACOBS (WRITER / DIRECTOR)

D.W. Jacobs is a playwright, director, actor and producer. In 1968, in a year filled with demonstrations. riots and assassinations, Jacobs saw Bucky speak at the College of Creative Studies at the invitation of his brother, Steve. In 1976. Diego Repertory Theatre with Sam Woodhouse and served as Artistic Director for 20 years. At San Diego Repertory Theatre, they created an interdisciplinary arts complex, presented multicultural work and nurtured surprisingly diverse audiences. In 1997, Jacobs resigned to focus more time on writing R. Buckminster Fuller: THE HISTORY (and Mystery) OF THE UNIVERSE. from the life, work and writings of R. Buckminster Fuller. The play had its World Premiere at San Diego Repertory Theatre on March 31, 2000. Directed by the author, this play has had almost 1,000 performances around the U.S. and Poland.

Foghouse Productions ran the play in San Francisco for 15 months, taking it to Chicago and Seattle. It was recently produced at San Jose Rep, Arena Stage (Washington, D.C.) and the American Repertory Theater (Harvard University), Jacobs has taught the design principles of playmaking for Playwrights Foundation, Synergetics Collaborative/ RISD and the Fuller Future Festival in Carbondale. He has twice lectured on Fuller's character, creativity and concepts of sustainability at the Wroclaw University of Technology, Poland. Jacobs recently co-founded a new company there, TEATRO ARROYO // Theater Stream, working in association with the Arroyo Arts Collective. He serves on the board of the Lummis Day Community Foundation. In 2016, Jacobs will perform the role of Bucky in a dome designed by Fuller and Shoji Sadao for the Center for Spirituality and Sustainability, at SIU, Edwardsville. - See more at: http://bit.ly/10yaU5s

DAVID LEE CUTHBERT (SCENIC & LIGHTING DESIGN)

Mr Cuthbert has been associated with HISTORY (and Mystery) since its inception. Previously for San Diego REP, Scenery, Lighting and Media on Zoot Suit, boom, and Women Who Steal. Broadway: Billy Crystal's 700 Sundays 2004, 2013, and HBO, Off Broadway: The Snow Queen at NYMF and The Open Theater's Terminal directed

by Joe Chaikin at PS122. San Diego Area: The Old Globe, La Jolla Playhouse and he was a Resident Artist at Sledgehammer Theater. Bay Area: The Magic, California Shakespeare, Theaterworks, Center Rep. San Francisco Plavhouse, and over twodozen productions at San Jose Rep. Regional: ART, Arena Stage, Intiman, A Contemporary Theatre, Indiana Rep, and he is a frequent collaborator at Arizona Theater Company. He is a Professor of Design at UC Santa Cruz.

DARLA CASH (COSTUME DESIGNER)

Darla's work is familiar to San Diego audiences, on and off stage. She is pleased to be a part of the 40th Anniversary Season of the San Diego REP with her contribution to THE HISTORY (and Mystery) OF THE UNIVERSE.

LUIS PEREZ-IXONEZTLI (SOUND DESIGNER)

Luis Perez-Ixoneztli was born in Mexico City and moved to the U.S.A. in 1987. Perez is an innate musician. he studied guitar at the Escuela Nacional de Musica UNAM in Mexico City. He has dedicated his life to the study of Pre-Columbian musical instruments for the past 45 years. Ixoneztli's first solo recording "Ipan in Xiktli Metzli" was published by the Mexican government in 1981, it was the first fusion ever created by using Pre-Columbian instruments from Mesoamerica and electronic devices.

JIM FINDLAY (PROJECTIONS DESIGNER)

Jim Findlay works across

boundaries as a theater artist, visual artist, and film-maker. His most recent work includes his original performances Vine of the Dead (2015), Dream of the Red Chamber (2014) and the direction and design of David Lang's Whisper Opera as well as the unreleased 3D film Botanica, His video installation in collaboration with Ralph Lemon, Meditation, is in the permanent collection of the Walker Art Center. He was a founding member of the Collapsable Giraffe and in partnership with Radiohole helped run the mythical Collapsable Hole from 2000-2013. In addition to his independent work, he has collaboratoed with many theater, performance and music artists including Daniel Fish, Aaron Landsman, the Wooster Group, Ridge Theater, Bang on a Can, Ralph Lemon, and Stew and Heidi Rodewald. His work has been seen at Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, BAM, Arena Stage, A.R.T. and over 50 cities internationally. In 2015 he received the Foundation for Contemporary Art Artist Grant and his previous awards include 3 Obies, 2 Bessies, 2 Princess Grace Awards, Lortel and Hewes Awards and residencies at Baryshnikov Arts Center, MacDowell, UCross, MassMOCA and Mt Tremper Arts.

RAY SUN (ASSOCIATE PROJECTIONS DESIGNER) Ray Sun Ruey-Horng is a video artist whose work has been seen in galleries and theaters internationally. Ray's works focus on human perception, memories and the uncanny experiences in our daily lives. In 2013, Ray was selected to attend Lincoln Center director's Lab. His recent video design works include: Lars Jan's MAKANDAL at Guggenheim Museum. The Assembly's That Poor Dream at New Ohio Theatre. Chia-Ming Wang's Richard III at the National Theatre Taipei. SAM WOODHOUSE (CO-FOUNDER, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR)

Co-founded San Diego REP with D.W. Jacobs in 1976, and has since worked as a director, producer or actor on more than 260 productions. As an actor, he has performed on The REP stages in The Seafarer, in the title role of King Lear, Proof. Hamlet and with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra in the title role of Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat. His recent directorial work with The REP includes: The Oldest Boy, Violet, Oedipus El Rey, HONKY, El Henry (with La Jolla Playhouse) Detroit, Venus in Fur, In the Heights, Federal Jazz Project, Clybourne Park, The Who's TOMMY, In the Next Room or the vibrator play, Threepenny Opera and Water & Power. In 2011 he directed American Night: The Ballad of Juan José for the Denver Center Theatre Company. In 2003, he was awarded the Patté Shilev Award for Lifetime Achievement by KPBS and the prestigious Alonzo Award by the Downtown San Diego Partnership. In 2006, he and Jacobs were honored with the Craig Noel Award by the San Diego Theatre Critics Circle for 30 years of artistic dedication to downtown and

diversity.



TODD SALOVEY (ASSOCIATE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR)

Todd Salovev is in his 26th season with The REP. Last year he partnered with Herbert Siguenza on the world premiere of Steal Heaven, following their collaborations on In the Time of the Butterflies and A Weekend with Pablo Picasso, which has also played at the Alley Theatre in Houston, Denver Center, Arizona Theatre Co, San Jose Stage, Los Angeles Theatre Center and Center Arts REP.
