

# Context leading up to Bill Cain's EQUIVOCATION

1485 – Henry VII defeats Richard III at the Battle of Bosworth Field, and the English Monarchy moves from the House of York to the House of Tudor.

1509 – 18-year old Henry VIII is crowned King. He will go through 6 wives (mainly trying to get a male heir).

1516 - Henry's first wife Catherine of Aragon has a daughter, Mary.

1517 ¬– Martin Luther nails his "Ninety-five Theses" on the door of a church in Wittenberg, which begins the Protestant Reformation.

1533 – Henry VIII has his marriage to Catherine annulled, marries Anne Boleyn (who will give him a daughter, Elizabeth) and is excommunicated by the Pope. Henry becomes Head of the new Church of England.

1547 – When Henry dies, his son (from third wife Jane Seymour who dies from complications of the birth) becomes Edward VI at the age of 9, and dies at 15. Protestant reforms continued.

1553 - Mary I becomes Queen and reinstates Catholicism as the State religion.

1558 – Mary dies of cancer and her half-sister Elizabeth I is crowned, reinstating Protestantism. William Cecil is her Secretary of State and chief advisor. He has Elizabeth's cousin, Mary Queen of Scots and mother of James, executed to prevent a Catholic rising. His son, Robert Cecil succeeds him in the position

1603 – Elizabeth dies without children. Cecil assures that the Protestant James VI of Scotland, becomes James I of England

1605 - The Gunpowder Plot to blow up Parliament and kill James is thwarted.

1606 – The time of our play. The Globe Theatre is London's most popular. It's resident company, The King's Men, include Richard Burbage, England's first great leading actor, and "William Shagspear", it's most popular playwright.

The trial and execution of the Powder Plot conspirators takes place.

# "Remember, Remember the 5th of November" THE GUNPOWDER PLOT

In the Spring of 1605 a group of 13 fervent Catholic young men begin discussing a plan to kill James I and return a Catholic to the English throne.

In the early morning of November 5th, 1605, Guy Fawkes is caught with 36 barrels of gunpowder in a vaulted room under Parliament.

The plot is thwarted, and the lives of King James, his family and his court are saved.

Bonfires are lit across England in celebration. This becomes an annual event (still celebrated each November 5th) known as Guy Fawkes Day and Bonfire Night.

The government uses this event, and the following trials and executions of the conspirators to unify the country around James I and to drive out Catholics, and destroy the Jesuits.

Much remains murky about the true details surround the Gunpowder Plot, especially the participation of the Jesuits.


Bill Cain explores the inconsistencies and gives a reasoned and insightful alternative to the "official" story.

## **EQUIVOCATION?**

Today the word "Equivocation" most often means the use of words or phrases that have multiple meanings in order to deceive or mislead. However, in the early 1600's it had a different meaning. Playwright Bill Cain says that Equivocation in its purest form is "a desperate search in impossible times to tell the real truth."

Cain quotes Miep Gies, who helped hide Anne Frank and her family from the Nazis during WWII, to illustrate equivocation. If asked, Gies would say, "We are hiding no one." This was the literal truth - they were indeed hiding not one, but many. Her equivocation – speaking the truth in dangerous times - would protect both the Frank family and Gies' own soul and conscience.

## SHAGSPEAR?



The man we know today as William Shakespeare actually had multiple different spelling associated with his last name. Among them, Shaxpere (on his marriage license) and Shagspear (in court records). Bill Cain chooses to call his character "Shagspear" to move him away from our normal expectations.

#### SHAKESPEARE'S PLAYS

A number of Shakespeare's works are mentioned in the play.

**HAMLET**: The character Hamlet is named for Shakespeare's son, Hamnet, who died at a young age. And the character Polonius is based on Sir Robert Cecil's father, William Cecil. This is a source of tension between Cecil and Shag in EQUIVOCATION.

**KING LEAR**: Lear goes mad after dividing his kingdom and giving it to his two evil daughters, while disowning his good daughter, out of pride. The storm scene (Act III, Scene 4) is seen in rehearsal in EQUIVOCATION, and individual lines from Lear are used throughout.

MACBETH ("The Scottish Play"): Macbeth murders Scottish King Duncan, thus fulfilling the Witches prophecy that he would become king. With the ascent of King James VI of Scotland to the English throne as James I of England in 1603, London culture became obsessed with all things Scottish. And James was fascinated by witches and the ways they enacted evil in the world. By tradition it is bad luck to say the name "Macbeth" in the theater if you are not performing the play. Instead it is referred to as "The Scottish Play." Macbeth is the play Shag writes to take down Robert Cecil. In EQUIVOCATION we see pieces of the play performed in front of James & Cecil.



### BILL CAIN, Author

While going to high school in New York City, Bill Cain used to watch plays from the back row of theatres 2 or 3 dollars, and watch Shakespeare in Central Park for free. He estimates he saw more than 80 plays over those four years. Through the theater Cain discovered that he lived in a much wider world than he

had imagined. In 1970 he graduated from Boston College and helped found the Boston Shakespeare Company, where he served as its artistic director for seven seasons. As a playwright, his first major play, Stand-Up Tragedy, was inspired by his time spent teaching in New York Public Schools. In addition to being a playwright, screenwriter and teacher, Cain is a Jesuit priest.
