

### FROM THE DIRECTOR

On the Twentieth Century, for those who are musical theatre fans, has almost a cult following. In the 1978 Broadway season, the show garnered nine Tony nominations, winning five, including Best Score, Best Book and most notably, Best Scenic Design. It was the depiction of the gleaming stainless steel of the famous luxury locomotive liner that was truly unforgettable. As a young high school theatre-geek, my friends and I acquired the cast album featuring Madeline Kahn, John Cullum, Imogene Cocoa and Kevin Kline. We MEMORIZED it. We sang it at cast parties. And when the National Tour opened in LA, we all went up to see it. I'll never forget it.

It's always been a dream to somehow get that show on our stage. And now with Sean Fanning and Blake McCarty's help, we have found a way to bring that Art Deco masterpiece of travel to life.

The musical is based upon a popular straight play called *Twentieth Century* from the late 1920s. The play was a hit on Broadway and in 1933 was put on film starring John Barrymore and Carole Lombard. The film is widely recognized as one of the first screwball comedies of the 1930s. The play was revived again in the 1950s with Jose Ferrer and Gloria Swanson. The glorious musical adaptation opened only ten years after the great liner went out of service, victim of the growing popularity of airline travel. But, thank goodness, screwball comedies will never grow out of style. Large egos, enormous stakes, whacky coincidences, and of course a lot of slamming doors. Who can argue with that?

with the 20th Century
Limited!

Marketed as "The Most Famous Train in the World," the 20th Century Limited was a scene of opulence and luxury that catered to the country's elite stars and business tycoons.

Household names encompassing meatpacking to department stores – such as Robert R. McCormick, Sewell Avery, Marshall Field, Julius Rosenwald, Philip Armour and Walter Chrysler, Sr. – were regular passengers. Famous for its speed and sophistication, the glamorous departure aboard New York Central's 20th Century Limited was comparable to a sailing on the Queen Mary, Liberte or United States.

After boarding "the Century" in downtown Manhattan

and settling in for the overnight trip to Chicago, one could enjoy cocktails in the observation car. dinner with views of the Hudson. a good night sleep, followed by breakfast in bed or in the dining car. Dress was business formal with no room for baseball caps. Standing in line for security, enduring a long cab ride or enduring hours on the tarmac because of bad weather were not

included in your first class Pullman fare.

The entryway to the Century's platform was bustling with passenger agents, Pullman conductors and New York Central conductors. Porters helped passengers to board and waiters stood at attention in the dining car while chefs busily prepared dinner. Caviar, filet mignon and lobster were mainstays on the menu. Bartenders in the three club cars took orders for Manhattans, Scotch highballs and very dry Martinis. Passenger services included train secretaries, manicurists, barbers, as well as a complimentary morning newspaper delivered directly to your room.

Beginning in 1938, along with the train's art deco makeover by Henry Dreyfuss, Manhattan's Grand Central began rolling out a plush crimson carpet that passengers would walk down to their waiting cars. Stretching from the observation car to the engine, the football field length rug was specially designed for the Century. Prior to boarding, men received carnations for their jackets, while women were gifted with flowers and perfume. And thus, the "red carpet treatment" was born.



**BETTY COMDEN & ADOLPH GREEN** Book & Lyrics

Comden and Green were an American

musical-comedy team who wrote scripts—and often the lyrics-for many

Broadway shows and Hollywood film musicals. They were paired together longer than any other writing team in the history of Broadway. They met in 1938 while both were making the rounds of theatrical agents. In 1944, they joined with composer Leonard Bernstein and choreographer Jerome Robbins in creating the musical On the Town, which later (1949) was filmed by MGM. In 1951, with Two on the Aisle, Comden and Green began their long collaboration with composer Jule Styne, who created the music for most of their shows, including Peter Pan (1954), Bells Are Ringing (1956), Say, Darling (1958), Do Re Mi (1960), Subways Are for Sleeping (1961), Fade Out-Fade In (1964), Hallelujah, Baby! (1967), and Lorelei (1974). Comden and Green won seven Tony Awards for Wonderful Town (1953), Hallelujah, Baby!, Applause (1970), On the Twentieth Century (1978), and The Will Rogers Follies (1991). They also wrote several film scripts, including that of Auntie Mame (1958) and Singin' in the Rain (1952), the latter of which was voted the best film musical of all time by the American Film Institute. Among their best-known songs are "Just in Time" and "The Party's Over." In 1980 Comden and Green were named to the Songwriters Hall of Fame.



CY COLEMAN Music

Coleman was born Seymour Kaufman in New York City. His winning streak as a Broadway composer began when he teamed up

with Carolyn Leigh to collaborate on the musical Wildcat (1960), which marked the Broadway debut of comedienne Lucille Ball. Up next for the two was Little Me, with a book by Neil Simon based on the novel by Patrick Dennis (Auntie Mame). In 1964. Coleman began collaborating with Dorothy Fields. Their first project was the Broadway smash Sweet Charity, again with a book by Neil Simon, and starring Gwen Verdon. After Sweet Charity the team of Coleman/Fields worked on the Broadway show Seesaw, which reached Broadway in 1973 and their partnership was cut short by Fields' death in 1974. Coleman remained prolific throughout the 1970s and 1980s. He composed the score for I Love My Wife (1977) with lyrics by Michael Stewart, and then On The Twentieth Century (1978) with Betty Comden and Adolph Green. In 1980, Coleman served as producer and composer for the circus-themed Barnum. Later in the decade, he collaborated on Welcome to the Club (1988) with A.E. Hotchner and City of Angels (1989) with David Zippel with book by Larry Gelbart. The 1990s brought two more new hit Cy Coleman musicals to Broadway: The Will Rogers Follies (1991), and The Life (1997) with lyricist Ira Gasman, Cy Coleman has received numerous awards including: Grammy's (3 wins, 13 nominations), Tony's (4 wins, 11 nominations), Emmy's (3 wins, 5 nominations), Oscar (1 Nomination for Sweet Charity), Songwriters Hall of Fame inductee, Johnny Mercer Award (Songwriter's Hall Of Fame), and the Richard Rogers Award for Lifetime Achievement in American Musical Theater (ASCAP).
