A Glossary of Terms Used in SILENT SKY

Great Refractor Telescope

A 15-inch telescope (right) installed at Cambridge, MA in 1847. It was the largest telescope in the United States for over 20 years and equal to the finest astronomical instrument in the world. It formed the nucleus for development of the Harvard College Observatory.

Stellar Photometry

The branch of astronomy that deals with the accurate measurement of the brightness, color and temperature of stars and the changes in their brightness over time. Determined by the careful reading of photographic plates taken with the use of telescopes.



Seven classes of star temperature devised by Annie Jump Cannon at the Harvard Observatory and designated by the letters O, B, A, F, G, K and M (remembered by the phrase "Oh Be A Fine Girl, Kiss Me") The hottest stars (O and B) are blue-white in color, while the coolest (M) are red. Each of the letter classes has subdivisions indicated by numerals 0 through 9.

Draper Catalogue

Its first edition published in 1890, the Draper Catalogue of Stellar Spectra contained spectroscopic classifications for 10,351 stars. Most of the classification was done by Williamina Fleming at the Harvard
