

### **CALLIE PRENDIVILLE**

is Associate Artistic Director of MOXIE Theatre and an actress, writer, educator and director. Her play, Blamed: An Established Fiction, won Best Drama at the San Diego Fringe Festival in 2015 (performed in Tijuana and San Diego), and the 2017 Hollywood Fringe Festival Scholarship, funded by the NEA. Blamed was then selected to perform Off-Broadway at the Soho Playhouse. Callie's play, The Plummer Project, about the history of Orange County and the illegal deportations of Mexican-Americans during

The Great Depression, received a Stories Grant from the California Humanities Association. As an actress she has performed at MOXIE, South Coast Repertory, La Jolla Playhouse, North Coast Repertory, Los Angeles Opera, Long Beach Playhouse, Chance Theatre, Downey Civic Light Opera and Lyric Opera San Diego. #### director's note

I came to MOXIE as an actor almost ten years ago and fell in love with the mission and the women leading it. When I discovered Dipika Guha's *Yoga Play* at the Pacific Playwright's Festival at South Coast Repertory two years ago, I knew it would be a great fit for MOXIE and for co-founder Jo Anne Glover. Using a killer subversive wit, Guha uses humor to pierce through the heart of issues of gender, cultural appropriation, and identity.

As we started rehearsals, Guha shared her inspiration for the play with us: "I had just moved to Berkeley and had begun thinking about California as a destination for wealth seekers as well as truth seekers. Yoga - as a spiritual practice - and now multi billion dollar business sat at the intersection of these interests. So my research consisted of surreptitiously going to yoga classes: In one particular class I found myself sitting opposite a straight white man playing on a harmonium with incredible depth and sincerity. His breadth of knowledge about yoga and deep affinity with Hinduism gave me an opening - a way to think about cultural appropriation in a way that surprised me and made me laugh - a lot. So that became the seed of the piece."

I am so thankful to MOXIE for being a space that supports women in their artistic careers and their ambitions to have families at the same time. Yoga Play was originally slated to open last fall, and when I found out I was going to have my son in September, MOXIE moved the entire season around and allowed me to create a non-traditional rehearsal schedule to accommodate my new life with an infant and still direct this play. Thanks to you, our audience, for supporting this mission by seeing this play. We hope you will join us again in our 15th Anniversary Season next year!
