director's note

Oxford English Dictionary

To handbag (verb): to verbally attack or crush (a person or idea) ruthlessly and forcefully.

It is rare that a person can inspire an addition to the Oxford English Dictionary. And yet, it was Margaret Thatcher, Britain's Conservative Prime MInister from 1979-1990, whose controversial policies, strategy, and bravado inspired this entry of a new word to the OED.

Oh, to have been a "fly on the wall" during the weekly meetings of Margaret Thatcher and Queen Elizabeth II from 1979-1990. Moira Buffini's wicked satire sneaks the audience in. Although it can never know exactly what happened during these meetings, Buffini lets the audience imagine. What was said between these titans over cups of afternoon tea at Buckingham Palace? How did these two leaders, representing respectively the soul and the practical power of a nation, get along? Did they find commonality in being uniquely female heads of state? What does/did they hope will be their lasting legacy in the world's eye?

Handbagged has two versions (younger and older) of Queen Elizabeth II and Margaret Thatcher shape the memory of their tenure as monarch and Prime Minister for an audience. They are aided by two actors who have been hired in the course of the show to play the many men in their lives. Both women exist as two halves of the same coin. Queen Elizabeth II is born to great status and yet cannot express practical power as monarch. Margaret Thatcher is born without status and yet rises to great practical power. Hubris and extreme Conservative policies (still a flash point of controversy and debate in Britain) ultimately lead to her downfall.

With great power, symbolic or practical, what is a leader to do? And, because they are female, what does the world say about these leaders when they are gone?

Welcome to a Battle Royale. Welcome to Moira Buffini's Handbagged.
