SEAN YAEL-COX (Guy de Bonheur) is an award-winning actor who made his stage debut at 12 years old as the Little Old Man in James And The Giant Peach and hasn't left the theatre since. Sean is the Artistic Director and co-founder (along with his wife, award-winning stage director Christy Yael-Cox) of Intrepid Theater Company. Sean is the director and co-creator of Intrepid's Shakespeare For A New Generation School Tour which has brought Shakespeare to over 100,000 students in Southern California.

As an actor he has played a variety of roles including the title characters in Richard II, Macbeth, Hamlet and The Elephant Man as well as John Proctor in The Crucible, Tom Wingfield in The Glass Menagerie, Edmond Tyrone in Long Days Journey Into Night, Anthony in Sweeney Todd, Pale in Burn This, Marc in ART, Walker/Ned in Three Days Of Rain (featuring Christy Yael-Cox and Jason Heil) and Smith in Suzan-Lori Parks Father Comes Home From The Wars Parts 1, 2 and 3. Shakespeare roles include Mercutio, Benedick, Oberon, Leontes, Puck, Malvolio, Autolycus, and the Bastard in King John. Regional Theaters include the Idaho, Nevada and Texas Shakespeare Festivals, PCPA Theaterfest, Old Globe, La Jolla Playhouse, Sierra Rep, North Coast Rep, Cygnet Theater, Moxie, and San Diego Rep. Training includes Pacific Conservatory of the Performing Arts and The Globe Theatre in London. Sean lives in San Diego with his wife and their two children.

JASON HEIL (Director) is a San Diego-based actor, director and teacher. For Intrepid Theatre, he previously directed *Turn of the Screw*. Other San Diego credits include *Plaid Tidings* (New Village Arts), *The Lion in Winter, You Never Can Tell, Ring Round the Moon, Barefoot in the Park, The Mousetrap, Born Yesterday* (Moonlight), *She Kills Monsters* (Grossmont College) and *Stop Kiss, A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Woman in Black* (with Kim Strassburger) and *I & You* (CSUSM). Acting credits include Off-Broadway and regionally at the Old Globe Theatres, La Jolla Playhouse, San Diego, Arkansas & Tennessee Repertory Theatres, A.C.T. (San Fran), Cygnet Theatre Company, ion theatre company, Intrepid, North Coast Rep, Compass Theatre, Moonlight Stage Productions, Starlight Theatre, Lamb's Players Theatre, Capital Stage, A Noise Within, & nine seasons with the Utah, Lake Tahoe, Marin, & Texas Shakespeare Festivals.

Kroc Institute of Peace and Justice at the University of San Diego), a suite of programs that include interactive theatre, a feature-length documentary film, community dialogue and a youth-drive summit to advance understanding among Muslims, Exiled Voices: The Refugee Art Experience (in partnership with Crawford High School and SAY San Diego), a community outreach and education program dedicated to cultivating empathy and understanding for vulnerable populations in our community through the power of visual and performing arts (now touring San Diego community centers and schools after presenting at the 2017 California Refugee Summit) and the inauguration of San Diego as a Regional City in the 2020 National August Wilson Monologue Competition for high school students. www.intrepidtheatre.org
